
Abstract National Exhibition

Juror

Pamela Caughey

Creating abstract or non-objective art can sometimes feel like walking in a dark tunnel without a light. It requires reaching beyond what we see in the world and looking inward for clues of what "could be" rather than trying to depict what we see in the world around us. Each entrant chose a personal journey into the unknown,



where they forged their own unique path as they pulled from within until they found balance, strength and conviction in their final work. Intuition, trial and error, triumphs and failures become the signposts that guide the abstract artist through their uncharted path. Abstract and non-objective artists resolve their story after many hours spent in the studio asking, "what if", and scrutinizing the results.

Unencumbered by the outer world, the artist's most inner thoughts and feelings have full reign, but that doesn't mean "anything goes", because it does not. Regardless of genre, works of excellence use the same design principles, exhibit technical proficiency and arise from mature thought. During the jurying process, I chose work of a very high standard which holds mystery and wonder, a certain, "je ne sais quoi", i.e., something special that just cannot be explained.

I am extremely honored to have had the privilege to jury the Abstract National Exhibition for Mark Arts. With over 900 entries and abundance of high caliber work, this was no easy task. I congratulate all of you who entered; you are all winners for your willingness to show your work in a public space. My intent during the selection process was to provide a broad cross section of mediums, styles, depth and breadth of abstract and non-objective contemporary work. For those artists whose works were not chosen, please remember one juror's choice is just that and limited space made my job extremely difficult. I hope all entrants will continue to ask themselves the important questions that drive their work forward and continue to develop their own unique visual language of art.

It is with great excitement and gratitude to Mark Arts (and each artist who entered) to present the chosen works for this exhibition. I believe this will be a show that challenges the viewer to take a closer look and truly marvel at the wide range of expression and boundless creativity.


